







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
Practical Strategies in Geriatric Mental Health

Physicians, psychologists, social workers, nurses, and even laypeople will appreciate the book's down-to-earth approach, as exemplified by the chapter on driving—an issue that can cause distress in patients, family, and the public.

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
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Behavioral and Psychological Symptoms of Dementia


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Clinical Manual of Palliative Care Psychiatry






