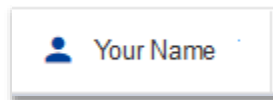

Sign in with your American Psychiatric Association (APA) credentials on <https://psychiatryonline.org/> by clicking the Sign In area shown below:



When you are successfully logged in the person icon will change from white to blue and your name will now display in the area where “Sign In” was previously.

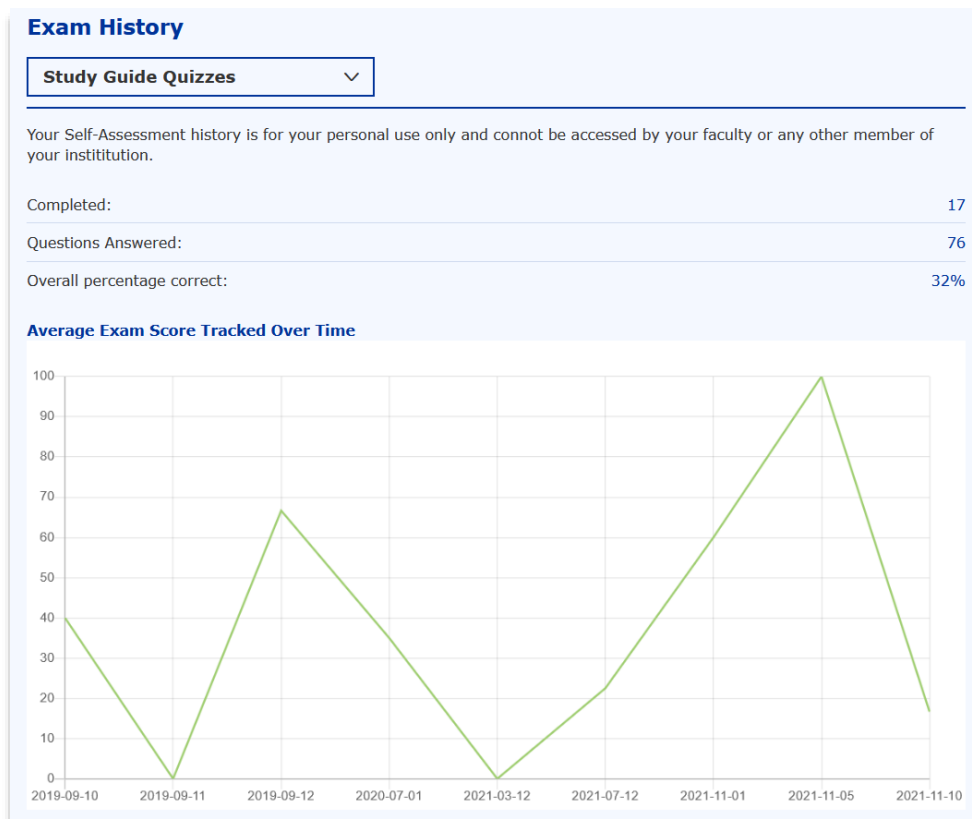

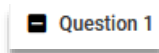

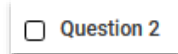

Within an activity, the list of questions on the left side of the screen will update to display back icons for completed questions and white icons for incomplete questions.

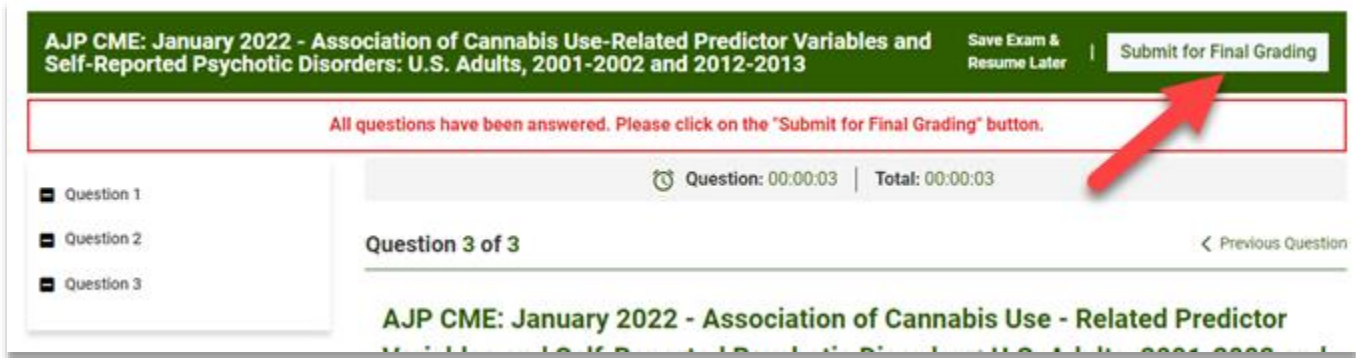


Example of Completed Question

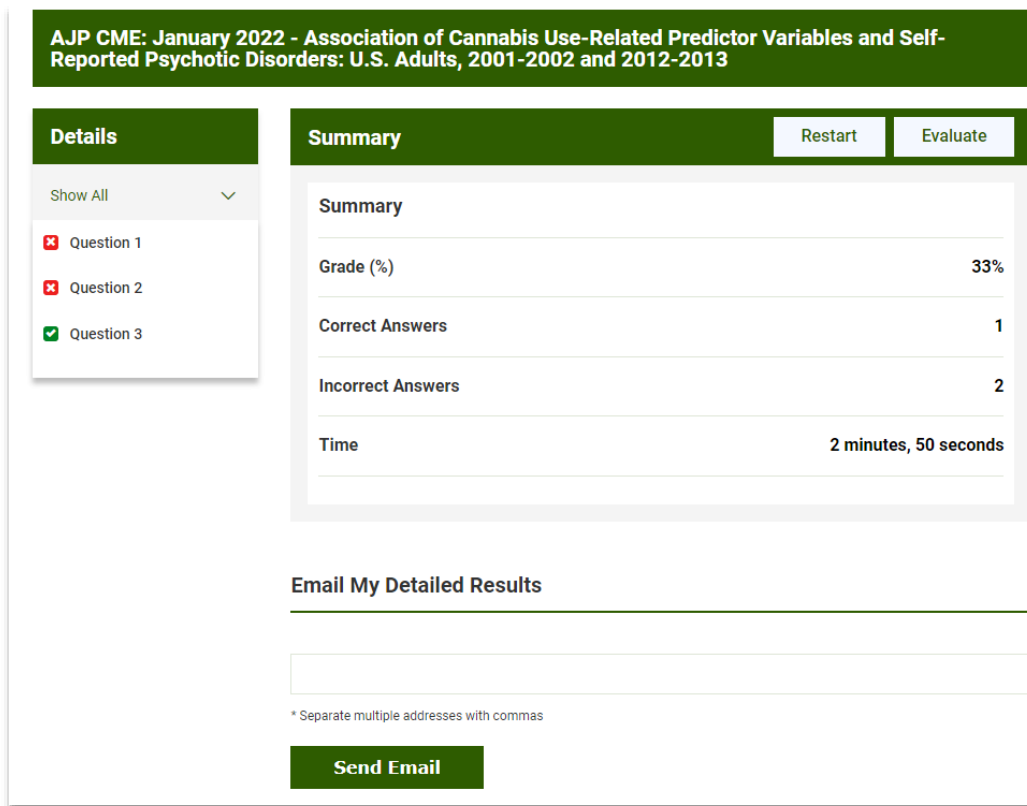


Example of Incomplete Question

- Once you have completed the last question of your activity, select “Submit for Final Grading” at the top right. This takes you to your Exam summary.



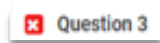
